



Beverley K. Swaim-Staley

President and CEO

As USRC President and CEO, Ms. Swaim-Staley manages Washington Union Station, one of the busiest transportation centers in the country, serving over 37 million visitors and passengers each year. During her tenure she has led the efforts to restore the historic Main Hall to its early 20th Century splendor. Currently she is overseeing the ongoing rehabilitation of the station in keeping with its historic standards and managing the latest redevelopment and expansion of Washington Union Station.

Prior to joining USRC, Beverley was the first woman to serve as Maryland Transportation Secretary. As Secretary, Ms. Swaim-Staley oversaw the only state department of transportation with direct supervision over all aspects of transportation, including the transit and rail networks, Baltimore/Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport, and the Port of Baltimore.

Beverley has a deep knowledge of transportation management and finance. She oversaw negotiations to execute one of the largest public-private partnership agreements in the nation resulting in the construction of a new 50-foot berth at the Port of Baltimore.

Previously, as Deputy Secretary, Ms. Swaim-Staley also served as Executive Director of Baltimore/Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport during the period which encompassed the terrorist strike on 9/11 and the subsequent revolution in airport security. She has also worked for the state legislature in Maryland and for the Washington Metropolitan Area Transportation Authority (WMATA).

Currently Beverley serves as a Board Member of the Mineta Transportation Institute and the Greater Washington Board of Trade.
