## PRIVATE TOURS AT UNION STATION

Recently, USRC has led three tours of the station:

#### Atlas Obscura Tour

On November 5th, in collaboration with <u>Atlas Obscura</u> and the National Trust for Historic Preservation, USRC President and CEO Beverley Swaim-Staley and Archivist Sarah Mayersohn led a group of 25 people on a behind-the-scenes tour of Union Station. In addition to visiting the West, East, and Main Halls, the participants were taken to areas usually not accessible to the general public, including:

- the Presidential Suite,
- the balcony area to see the Roman Legionnaires up close, and
- the H Street Bridge underpass.

The tour participants enjoyed learning about the station and its history. Many thanks to all who attended.

#### Russian Disability Rights Advocates Tour

On November 1st, in collaboration with the <u>Maryland Leningrad Sister State</u> <u>Committee</u> and the <u>Open World Leadership Center</u> at the Library of Congress, USRC was honored to organize a tour of Union Station for a group of disability rights advocates visiting from St. Petersburg, Russia. The tour commenced in the station's glorious Main Hall and then proceeded to the metro, the train tracks, and the bus deck. Many thanks to representatives from WMATA, Amtrak, and Megabus for joining the tour and explaining their companies' policies and initiatives with regard to persons with disabilities. All participants and speakers had a good time and learned a lot.

#### American Planning Association Tour

As part of their Annual Conference, 20 members of the <u>Nation Capital Area Chapter</u> of the American Planning Association (APA) took a tour of Union Station on October 27, 2017. Representatives from APA, Amtrak, and USRC informed the participants about the station's past, present, and future. The tour began in the Main Hall with an overview of the station's history, as it relates to transportation planning and recently completed projects. The group then went to the Claytor Concourse and some of Amtrak's back-of-house areas to learn about the upcoming renovation of the concourse, as well as some of the current projects that are being performed in the lead-up to the renovation. The tour ended on the parking garage deck, which provides a stunning view of the rail yard and train operations, where ongoing planning efforts for the station expansion environmental review, traffic planning challenges on H Street, and the air rights development were discussed.

# - UNION STATION PROJECTS -

### **RETAIL CONCOURSE CEILING RESTORATION**

The Retail Concourse ceiling repairs were completed on November 14, 2017. The restoration, which began in April 2016, included strengthening of the barrel-vaulted ceiling structure and face repairs to the plaster coffers. The significant restoration can be seen by walking through the Retail Concourse Mezzanine and looking up to the freshly-painted ceiling and sparklingly clean laylight glass.

## UNION STATION DOOR LOCKING

In order to enhance security in the station, USRC; property manager, JLL; and Amtrak have partnered on the Overnight Limited Access Plan. As part of the plan, the three main sets of doors at the front of the station will be the only points of entry between 12am and 5am - all other exterior doors will be locked during this time. It is important to note that the station will remain open. Any ticketed passengers or employees of the station will be allowed to enter and exit through the Main Hall doors located at the front colonnade. Additionally, the parking garage will continue to be a 24/7 operation, maintaining regular access to the station and H Street NE. # FAST CHARGING STATIONS FOR EV TAXIS AT UNION STATION

A public-private partnership (PPP) between the District of Columbia <u>Department of</u> <u>For-Hire Vehicles</u> (DFHV), <u>ChargePoint</u>, Transco, and Union Station has resulted in the installation of two fast charging stations in the Union Station Parking Garage for the exclusive use of the District's electric vehicle (EV) taxicabs. This project improves the infrastructure to encourage the transition to electric taxis. As part of a robust plan to build additional fast charging stations around the city, DFHV provided partial funding through a competitive grant program; ChargePoint supports all of the technology that powers this network (including charging station hardware, energy management software, and a mobile app); Transco handles the administration of these units; and Union Station provides oversight of the infrastructure and operations.
