



Beverley K. Swaim-Staley

President and CEO

As President and CEO of Union Station Redevelopment Corporation (USRC), Ms. Swaim-Staley manages Washington Union Station, one of the busiest transportation centers in the country, serving over 37 million visitors and passengers each year. During her tenure, she led the efforts to restore the historic Main Hall to its early 20th Century splendor. Currently, she is overseeing the ongoing rehabilitation of the station in keeping with its historic standards, along with the latest redevelopment and expansion.

Prior to joining USRC, Ms. Swaim-Staley was the first woman to serve as Maryland Secretary of Transportation. As Secretary, she managed the only state department of transportation with direct supervision over all aspects of transportation, including the transit and rail networks, Baltimore/Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport (BWI), and the Port of Baltimore.

Beverley has extensive knowledge of transportation management and finance. She oversaw negotiations to execute one of the largest public-private partnership agreements in the country, resulting in the construction of a new 50-foot berth at the Port of Baltimore.

Previously, in her capacity as Maryland Deputy Secretary of Transportation, Ms. Swaim-Staley served as Executive Director of Baltimore/Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport. During this period, the terrorist strike on 9/11 and the subsequent revolution in airport security occurred. Formerly, she worked for the Washington Metropolitan Area Transportation Authority (WMATA).

Beverley serves as a Board Member of the Mineta Transportation Institute, the Greater Washington Board of Trade, the BWI Business Partnership, and the Capitol Hill BID.
